

SUNDAY OF THE OINTMENT-BEARING WOMEN (Third Paschal Sunday)

Christ is Risen from the dead, conquering death by death and to those in the tombs bestowing life.

Christos Voskrese eez mertvik, smertiyu smert poprav, ee suschim vo hrobeek, zhivot daruvaw!

Troparion (2): When You went down to death, O Life Immortal, You struck Hades dead with the blazing light of Your divinity. When You raised the dead from the nether world, all the powers of heaven cried out: O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory be to You!

Troparion (2): The noble Joseph took down Your most pure body from the

cross. He wrapped it in a clean shroud, and with fragrant spices laid it in burial in a new tomb. But You arose in three days, O Lord, bestowing great mercy upon the world.

Troparion (2): The angel stood by the tomb and cried out to the women bringing ointment: Ointments are for the dead, but Christ has shown Himself not subject to corruption. So now cry out: The Lord has risen, bestowing great mercy upon the world.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion (2): By Your resurrection, O Christ our God, You told the women bringing ointment to rejoice; and You stilled the weeping of Eve, the first mother. You instructed the women to announce to Your apostles: The Savior has risen from the tomb.

Now and for ever and ever: Amen.

Kontakion (8): Although You descended into the grave, O Immortal One, You destroyed the power of Death. You arose again as a victor, O Christ God. You announced to the women bearing ointment: Rejoice! You gave peace to Your apostles and resurrection to the fallen.

Prokimenon:

Save Your people, O Lord, and bless Your inheritance. Verse: To You, O Lord, I call; my God, be not deaf to me.

Epistle: Reading of the Acts of the Holy Apostles. (Acts 6,1-7)

At that time, as the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the

disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

Alleluia

Lord, You once favored Your land and revived the fortunes of Jacob. Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia.

Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced.

Gospel: (Mk 15,43-47:16,1-8)

At that time, Joseph of Arimathea, a distinguished member of the council, who was himself awaiting the kingdom of God, came and courageously went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate was amazed that he was already dead. He summoned the centurion and asked him if Jesus had already died. And when he learned of it from the centurion, he gave the body to Joseph. Having bought a linen cloth, he took him down, wrapped him in the linen cloth and laid him in a tomb that had been hewn out of rock. Then he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses watched where he was laid. When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go and anoint him. Very early when the sun had risen, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb. They were saying to one another, "Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" Then they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large. On entering the tomb they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they were utterly amazed! He said to them, "Do not be afraid! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Behold, the place where they laid him. But go and tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you." Then they went out and fled from the tomb, seized with trembling and bewilderment. They said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

It is truly right... (Or the Hirmos of the Feast):

An angel greeted you O full of grace; O purest Virgin Rejoice! And again I say rejoice! For after three days your Son has risen from the dead, and then raised the dead with himself, people everywhere rejoice!

Shine forth in splendor, New Jerusalem! For the glory of the Lord is risen on you! Skip for joy in happy festival O Sion, and you O purest One, Mother of God, rejoice in the resurrection of your Son.

After "Save your People", after "Blessed be the name of the Lord"

Christ is Risen from the dead, conquering death by death and to those in the tombs bestowing life.

And He gives us eternal life, we bow down to his third day resurrection from the dead.

The First Witness

The Resurrection of the Lord is the renewal of human nature, and the renewal, re-creation, and return to immortality of the first Adam who was swallowed up by death because of sin, and through death went back to the earth from which he was formed. In the beginning nobody saw Adam being made and brought to life, for no one existed yet at that time. However, once he had received the breath of life breathed into him by God (Gn 2:7), a woman was the first to see him, for Eve was the first human being after him. In the same way, no one saw the second Adam, that is the Lord, rising from the dead, since none of His disciples were present and the soldiers keeping the tomb had been shaken with fear and became like dead men. But after the Resurrection it was a woman who saw him first of all.

There is something which the Evangelists tell us in a veiled way, but which I shall reveal to your charity. As was right and just, the Mother of God was the first person to receive from the Lord the Good News of the Resurrection, and she saw Him risen and had the joy of His divine words before anyone else. She not only beheld Him with her eyes and heard Him with her ears, but was the first and only person to touch with her hands His most pure feet. If the Evangelists do not say all this openly it is because they do not want to put forward his Mother as a witness, lest they give unbelievers grounds for suspicion.
