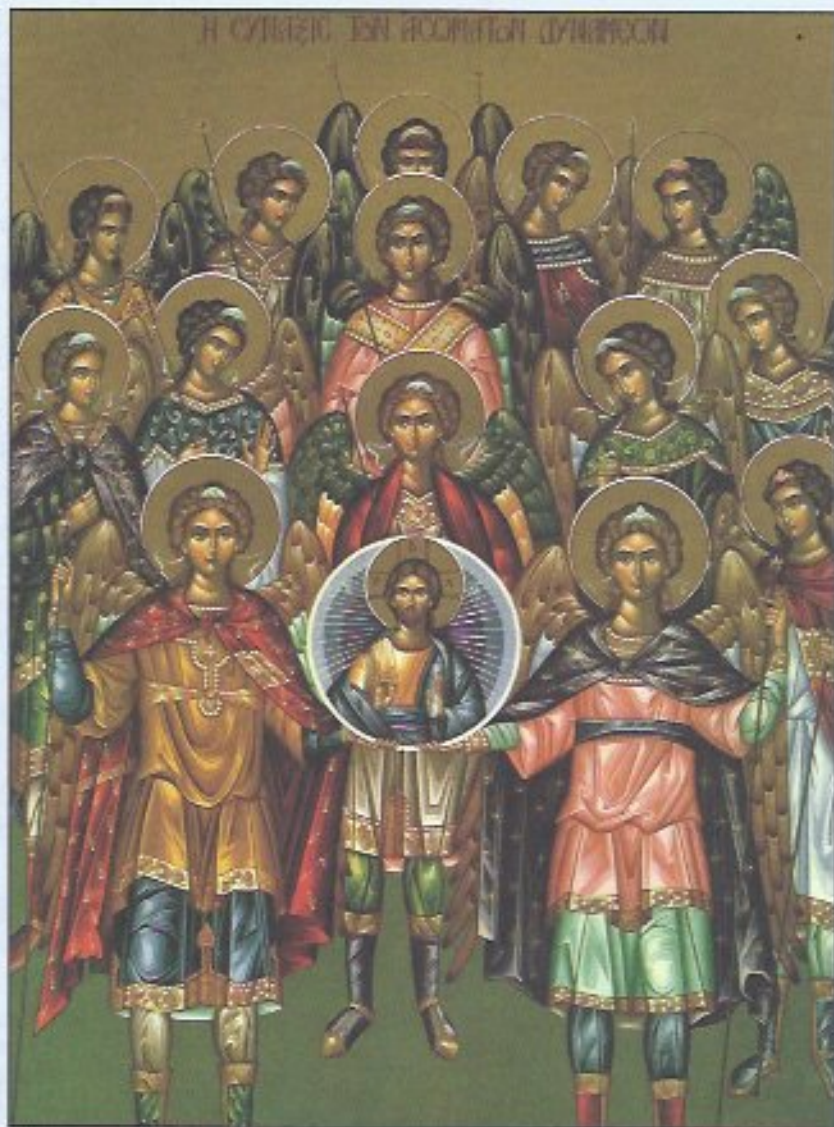

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST:

Troparion (5):

Let us the faithful acclaim and worship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, and born of the Virgin for our salvation. For He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh, to suffer death and to raise the dead by His glorious resurrection.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion (5):

You, my Savior, descended to Hades, and as the Almighty, You shattered its gates. With Yourself You, as Creator, raised the dead and shattered the sting of death, and delivered Adam from the curse, O Lover of Mankind. And so we cry out: Save us, O Lord.

Now and for ever and ever: Amen.

Theotokion (5): Rejoice, O Impassable Door of the Lord! Rejoice, O Rampart and Protection of those who have recourse to you! Rejoice, O Tranquil Haven and Virgin, who gave birth in the flesh to your Maker and God! Fail not to intercede for those who sing and worship the Child you bore.

Prokimenon (5):

You, O Lord, will guard us and will keep us from this generation, and for ever.

Verse: Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer left a just man.

Epistle: Reading of the Epistle of St. Paul to the Galatians. (Gal 6,11-18)

Brethren: See with what large letters I am writing to you in my own hand! It is those who want to make a good appearance in the flesh who are trying to compel you to have yourselves circumcised, only that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. Not even those having themselves circumcised observe the law themselves; they only want you to be circumcised so that they may boast of your flesh. But may I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither does circumcision mean anything, nor does uncircumcision, but only a new creation. Peace and mercy be to all who follow this rule and to the Israel of God. From now on, let no one make troubles for me; for I bear the marks of Jesus on my body. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers. Amen.

TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

At that time, a man named Jairus, an official of the synagogue, came to Jesus. He fell at the feet of Jesus and begged him to come to his house, because he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying. As he went, the crowds almost crushed him. And a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years, who had spent her whole livelihood on doctors and was unable to be cured by anyone, came up behind him and touched the tassel on his cloak. Immediately her bleeding stopped. Jesus then asked, "Who touched me?" While all were denying it, Peter said, "Master, the crowds are pushing and pressing in upon you." But Jesus said, "Someone has touched me; for I know that power has gone out from me." When the woman realized that she had not escaped notice, she came forward trembling. Falling down before him, she explained in the presence of all the people why she had touched him and how she had been healed immediately. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you; go in peace." While he was still speaking, someone from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter is dead; do not trouble the teacher any longer." On hearing this, Jesus answered him, "Do not be afraid; just have faith and she will be saved." When he arrived at the house he allowed no one to enter with him except Peter and John and James, and the child's father and mother. All were weeping and mourning for her, when he said, "Do not weep any longer, for she is not dead, but sleeping." And they ridiculed him, because they knew that she was dead. But he took her by the hand and called to her, "Child, arise!" Her breath returned and she immediately arose. He then directed that she should be given something to eat. Her parents were astounded, and he instructed them to tell no one what had happened.

The Holy Archangel Michael is one of the most celebrated of the Angels and bodiless powers; he is called the *Archistrategos*, or chief commander, of all the bodiless powers. According to Holy Scripture and Tradition, he has interceded for humanity multiple times and continues to serve as the Defender of the Faith. St Michael is most often invoked for protection from invasion by enemies and from civil war, and for the defeat of adversaries on the field of battle. He is celebrated primarily on November 8, the Synaxis of Michael and all the Bodiless Powers of Heaven.

FEAST OF ST MICHAEL

We honor the Archangel Michael and all the heavenly hosts on their feast day Wednesday evening at 5:30PM with the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. The prayer of St Michael is a powerful tool in our daily spiritual battles.

THE RANKS OF ANGELS

There is a hierarchy among the angels. The highest includes the **Seraphim**, (Isaiah 6:12) they blaze with love for God and kindle it in others. **The many-eyed Cherubim** (outpouring of wisdom, enlightenment) stand before the Lord, through them people's minds are enlightened. **The Thrones** stand after the cherubim, they are ministers of God's justice, giving to mankind the capacity for righteous judgment.

The middle ranks of angels are **the Dominions**, the dominions teach us to subdue sinful impulses, to master our will and to conquer temptation. **The Powers** fulfill the will of God without hesitation. They work great miracles and give the grace of wonderworking to saints pleasing to God. **The Authorities** have authority over the devil. They protect people from demonic temptations and uphold them in their struggle with evil thoughts.

The lowest hierarchy of angels includes the **Principalities**, who have a command over the lower angels. They watch over the world protecting the nations and peoples. **The Archangels** are messengers of great and wondrous tidings. They reveal prophecies and the mysteries of the faith. **Angels** are in the lowest rank of the heavenly hierarchy and the closest to people. They guide people to a virtuous and holy life. They never abandon us and they are always prepared to help us.

The Lord appointed the **Holy Archangel Michael**, which in Hebrew means "who is like unto God" as the chief commander of the angels.

Gabriel : the strength or power of God, herald and servitor of Divine omnipotence. He announces the mysteries of God

Raphael : the healing of God, the curer of human infirmities (Tobit 3:15 12:15)

Uriel: The fire or the light of God, enlightener. We pray to him to enlighten those with darkened minds. (3Ezdras 5:20)

Selaphiel: the prayer of God, he prays to God for mankind (3 Ezdras 5:16)

Jehudial: the raising up to God

Barachiel: Distributor of blessings of God for good deeds, entreats the mercy of God for people.

Jeremiel : the raising up to God (3 Ezdras 4:36)

May we call upon the angels of God to help us and surround us with the light of faith. In the baptismal ceremony we declare: we are given the companion of an angel of light, to accompany us on our journey. May we seek his guidance and assistance in life.

St Michael the Archangel, deliver us in the day of battle, be our safeguard against the wicked snares of the enemy. May God rebuke him we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, cast into hell, Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen

Messengers of God's Presence

Angels are a commercial enterprise. It is easy to find images of them in books, statuettes, lapel pins, and holy cards. They convey assurance and holiness to many people. Yet a moment's reflection upon the biblical witness to angels reminds us that they are about much more than the sweetness of a beautiful face with wings.

There is a long tradition in the Hebrew Bible that God reigns in the midst of a heavenly council of angels. The First Book of Kings 22:19 describes such a scene: "I saw the LORD sitting on his throne, with all the host of heaven standing beside him to the right and to the left of him." The biblical tradition, therefore, presents God's will as being mediated to humans through the activity of spiritual beings. The angels bear the news of God's good favor to earth.

Because angels are messengers of God's presence to us, their actions in the bible portray God's justice, love and protection. God is

just, and many times the bible presents angels executing God's justice. But God's love is also revealed as angels announce the great events of salvation.

There has been concern throughout Christian history that the respect we direct towards angels should not compete with the worship which we give to God alone. St. Augustine is credited with the most useful explanation of how to keep the proper perspective. He teaches that we venerate angels "out of charity, not out of servitude." Angels are messengers of God's presence. They are not intended to be an object of fascination in themselves but a reflection back to the love of the One who sends them. If angels do not lead us to a deeper commitment in our relationship with God, they have failed utterly in their mission.

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
